### **Cycleway Diversion in Millers Point**

I refer to your emails about the temporary cycleway diversion due to building works at Fort Street Public School.

***I commend you and the Millers Point Community Resident Action Group for your strong advocacy on this issue, and for working alongside the City of Sydney to achieve a better and safer alternative.***

As you know, School Infrastructure NSW (SINSW) has now informed the City that it plans to redirect the Harbour Bridge cycleway along Upper Fort St and on NSW Department of Education land, adjacent to the construction site. This outcome followed strong advocacy from the City, the Member for Sydney and the Millers Point community.

I welcome this plan, as the temporary cycleway will now align closely with the existing Harbour Bridge cycleway. The original proposal would have been a much poorer outcome for bike riders, residents and local businesses.

You will recall I wrote to the Minister for Transport late last year to ask that he listen to residents' concerns about safety and avoid a cycleway diversion along Kent Street. I also asked that Transport for NSW (TfNSW) build the cycleway – or at least parts of it that would solve conflict with construction – before the school redevelopment begins. I thank SINSW and TfNSW for responding to the City and the community's concerns.

***And I congratulate the Millers Point Community Resident Action Group on achieving this important victory for your community.***
